We will continue to follow our phonics programme with Little Wandle, reading a stories, learning new rhymes and new sounds. We will continue to identify the sounds we hear by playing What's in the box? and blend from the box.

EXPRESSIVE ART AND DESIGN

The children will continue to dance, sing and perform nursery rhymes. They will listen to familiar songs whilst experimenting with sound using musical instruments. The children will be using a variety of tools and media to promote junk modelling and artwork around topic work and the children's interests.

MATHS

The children will be learning positional language as well as exploring 2D and 3D shapes. We will continue to develop our number recognition with quantities and digits.

We will compare quantities using more than and fewer and look at what comes before and after different numbers.

We will continue to count beyond 10.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

The children will begin to re tell stories with repeated phrases. This will help them build up their vocabulary and learn to speak using more complex sentences and different tenses. The children will also be encouraged to make up their own rhymes.

PERSONAL SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

In our weekly PSHE Jigsaw lessons, we will be covering the topics Changing Me and Relationships. As the term progresses children will begin to think about changes and making new friends with the beginning of transition into Reception.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Our focus for the first half term is growing. We will be thinking about how we have grown and then growing lots of different plants from seeds. We will be learning about stories from around the world and special places in RE.

Our topic for the second half term is Minibeasts where we will be learning all about different insects, creating bug houses and learning about lifecycles.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Children will have the opportunity to experiment using the outdoor equipment to develop their gross motor skills. In PE lessons, they will learn some basic gymnastic skills and recap on ball skills.

They will also continue to work on fine motor skills and be encouraged to use correct pencil grip to begin to form pre-writing shapes or letters.
